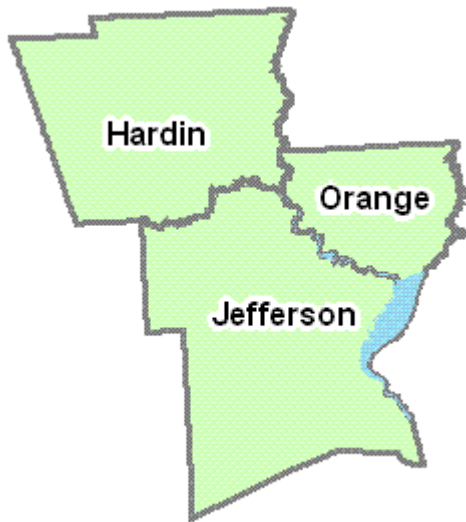

Volunteer Opportunities

All volunteers are required to complete an online registration process, a short online training module about the purpose and method for the Count, as well as a one hour face-to-face training to learn about the logistics of PIT Day including surveying techniques and safety practices.

PIT Crew Volunteers:

On-the-ground volunteers who go in pairs or groups out into the community to count and survey homeless individuals throughout the day. PIT Day volunteers sign-up for 4 hour shifts at various times throughout the 24-hour count.

PIT Crew Champions:

Special PIT volunteers who have lived experience with homelessness. PIT Champions offer unique insight into strategies for effective engagement and outreach into the homeless community. Champions are an essential part of the planning process and ensure that PIT Count activities are both appropriate and respectful of this vulnerable population.



PIT Crew Leaders:

These community leaders recruit 4-10 volunteers from their personal network of organizations or businesses in order to ensure success for the 2020 PIT Count.

Crew Leaders attend a Leadership Roundtable in December to learn more about the PIT Count and how to effectively recruit and serve as liaisons to their crew of volunteers.

PIT Crew House Hoppers:

Special team of volunteers who facilitate the PIT Count for shelter facilities throughout the region. House Hopper volunteers are assigned to specific shelters and the time commitment ranges from 30 minutes to 3 hours depending on the facility and location.

PIT Crew Captains:

These community leaders are responsible for coordinating PIT Crews for a specified area on PIT Day. Crew Captains ensure that their crews have necessary supplies and are each assigned to a specific geographic territory so that all areas of the region are canvassed by PIT Volunteers. Crew Captains work closely with the PIT Lead (Janeal) to prepare before PIT Day and are expected to be on-site at their assigned venue throughout PIT Day.

Sponsorship Opportunities

PIT Crew T-Shirt Sponsors:

PIT Day t-shirts serve as a means to identify official PIT volunteers while they are out in the community on PIT Day. Sponsorships are available for \$500, \$250, \$150, and \$50 donations. Sponsor names and/or logos will be displayed on the back of shirts based on donation amount.

PIT Crew Fuel Funders:

The first wave of PIT Count volunteers begin by 8am on PIT Day. The availability of simple food items such as hamburgers, sandwiches, pizza, etc. is an appreciated way to send volunteers out to do the important work of counting our local homeless. Donations of food and beverages from organizations and businesses are welcome.

PIT Day Writing Pens with Stylus:

Writing pens with stylus are needed to allow volunteers to complete online PIT surveys effectively even in cold weather. Sponsorship of pens is estimated at \$150..

A Little Something Sweet & A Little Bit of Fizz:

Donations of soft candies (such as peppermint patties or Reese's cups), hard candies (such as butterscotch disks and peppermints) and name brand soft drinks are given to the homeless as an added surprise. Sponsorship amount varies depending on type of item and quantity.
